An innovative GREEN transport scheme located in Hayling Island, Hartley Wintney and Paulsgrove




THE PLAN

GOTO was set up as an innovative and hyperlocal e-bike ride and delivery service.

Launched in October 2022 - with a trained Pioneer or volunteer providing a light-touch, friendly connection to access local suppliers, services and activities by E-bike

Sign up and on-going access was promoted via a dedicated GOTO app, alongside the more traditional GNN tried and tested approach the humble phone call



THE PROJECT WAS BOTH MOBILE AND RESPONSIVE

 Equipped with its own dedicated E-van to transport equipment from location to location, the project was able to 'pop up' in all sorts of places and covered fetes and festivals, alongside its regular weekly slots which were supported by the established GNN groups in Hayling Island and Hartley Wintney.



TRI-SHAW RIDES

These rides proved to be the most successful component of the GO TO project, - come rain or shine and some subzero temperatures, a trained Pioneer would cycle folk to appointments, shopping or for a 'spin' around their locality, often with a friend and sometimes even a dog.

The journey would allow for an informal chat and for some participants became a regular highlight of their week.

THE DELIVERY SERVICE

While this element of the project didn't quite develop as originally intended, the E-cargo bikes were successfully used to delivery all sorts of things, including festive hamper and turkey deliveries at Christmas and even 'shipments' of manure to a local allotment.

In Paulsgrove we adapted the scheme from the outset and worked closely with the Paulsgrove Panty on developing a delivery service and St M's Events to get FREE hot meals to locals in sheltered housing.




SANTA'S LITTLE HELPERS ON WHEELS



EXTREME WEATHER

The snow fell in December, the wind howled in July - it was bracing and didn't really stop raining until Summer was bookened by the hottest June on record with temperatures reaching over 33C - so then we got hot!



OUTCOMES

TARGET

- To set up at three locations, Hayling Island, Hartley Wintney and Emsworth
- Recruit 10 volunteers at each location
- Connect with 50 participants at each location
- Reduce loneliness through transport to social opportunities

ACTUAL

- Hayling Island and Hartley Wintney were up and running with strong support from the local groups, Emsworth proved a harder nut to crack, and the project switched focus to a new area, Paulsgrove
- Recruited 10 volunteers in total
- Connections and interest made with over 200 people, 20 who were actual participants
- YES, achieved final target albeit in smaller numbers

THE LEARNING

CONSIDERATIONS

- The project was undeniably impacted by the weather
- The late start to funding meant we missed an all-important Summer '22 start
- The E-van journeys often gave the Pioneers 'range anxiety', the infrastructure for charging is just not there yet – 'should have purchased a hybrid van'
- The project really required two years to reach anticipated targets and significant adjustments were required along the way
- A dedicated Pioneer in each area may have produced results quicker and connected more volunteers to the project

POSITIVES

- Feedback demonstrated all participants loved and really felt the benefits from the Tri-shaw
- A solution to loneliness was delivered in a environmentally friendly, creative and innovative way with no mention of the word lonely
- GO TO proved the power of a regular informal chat and friendly face when dealing with loneliness
- The Tri-shaw rides will be continued by Hartley Wintney Volunteer Services in 2024
